

## Total Trihalomethanes MCL Template

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

#### CAMARGO Has Levels of Total Trihalomethanes Above Drinking Water Standards

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. Testing results we received on 09/16/2024 show that our system exceeds the standard, or maximum contaminant level (MCL), for total trihalomethanes (TTHMs). The standard for TTHMs is 0.080 milligrams per liter (mg/L). The average level of TTHMs over the last year was .083 mg/L.

#### What should I do?

- **You do not need to use an alternative (e.g., bottled) water supply.** However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.

#### What does this mean?

This is not an immediate risk. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. *However, some people who drink water containing trihalomethanes in excess of the MCL over many years may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous systems, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer.*

#### What happened? What is being done?

Continued monitoring and increased flushing will be required to maintain levels below the drinking water standard. We anticipate resolving the problem within the next few weeks, although follow up testing will not occur until Nov. 15, 2024.
